## TIPS

- Pre-Planning: Using the storyboard template, plan out your trailer keeping the following things in mind:
  - a. The first slide should be a "hook," usually in the form of a question. (eg. "What would you do if you were given a second chance?"...not "my book is...")
  - b. Use short phrases or words and questions throughout the book trailer. Do not use hard to read font colors such as red or yellow.
  - c. The last slide should be a question (eg. "will he survive or be eliminated like the rest?") followed by a picture of the book cover and author's name.
  - d. The credits should be on the last slide, so be sure to have a Word document with the urls of pictures and/or video clips you have used.

- Before you go to the computer
  - a. Have your teacher look at your storyboards in order to receive feedback and to make sure you have included everything you need before beginning your trailer.

## Start Collecting Images/Video Clips/Music

- a. Creativecommons.org is a great place to start. Using Jamendo, Flickr and Pixabay are your best bet. Also Pics4Learning will help you find copyright friendly images. If you need to grab some music from \*Youtube, use N1OnlineConverter. It is best to use music with no lyrics, so I strongly urge you to use Jamendo.
- b. If you use anything from Google images, be sure to click on the SEARCH TOOLS button at the top of the page and then USAGE RIGHTS. Click on LABELED FOR REUSE.
- c. Open NoodleTools so you can start a Cited Works for any images, videoclips or music you use.
- d. If you are using MovieMaker or PhotoStory, save your pictures as jpeg files. If you use a PowerPoint slide as a title page, save it as a jpeg.
- e. Save everything to your OneDrive!!!!
