<u>SCPro™ Level One</u>: Cornerstones of Supply Chain Management assesses knowledge of eight elements of supply chain management through an exam comprised of multiple-choice questions.

SCPro™ Level Two: Analysis and Application of Supply Chain Challenges assesses ability to apply supply chain knowledge through a case study-based exam.

<u>SCPro™ Level Three</u>: Initiation of Supply Chain Transformation assesses ability to demonstrate knowledge, skills, and abilities through completion of a well-defined project in a real-world setting. Successful completion of the project demonstrates the gamut of supply chain management skills needed to positively impact an organization.






## MIT MicroMaster's Credential in Supply Chain Management



- Series of 5 on-line certification courses...pay for formal credit or take for free for certificate
- Then apply to MIT for the Blended SCM Master's Degree
- If accepted, on site at MIT for January to May to take courses on campus for graduation at the beginning of June.
- So what?
  - MicroMaster's Credential course is free if you want to only take classes
  - If you want the official credential, it costs \$150
  - If you want to continue to pursue the Master's then this gives you almost half of required units required for completion <a href="https://scm.mit.edu/micromasters">https://scm.mit.edu/micromasters</a>
