



## July 4th Events in Chapel Hill & Orange County, NC

Carrboro's July 4th Celebration will be held at the Carrboro Town Hall at 301 W. Main Street. The day begins on the Weaver Street Market Lawn at 9:30 am with music by Tim Stambaugh. A parade from the Market Lawn to the Town Hall is at 10:50 am. There enjoy plenty of activities including a pie eating contest, face painters, games, inflatables, bingo, food vendors, readings and live music. Activities run to 4 pm

The Town of Carrboro will hold its third <u>Annual Community Reading</u> of Frederick Douglass' essay "The Meaning of July Fourth for the Negro" on Monday, July 4 in the Carrboro Century Center from Noon - 1:30 pm. Introductory remarks will be provided by Dr. Blair L.M. Kelley, the Assistant Dean for Interdisciplinary Studies and International Programs for the College of Humanities and Social Sciences at North Carolina State University. This piece reflects a sobering point of view about what is commonly considered to be America's Independence Day, and is a part of the history of this country that needs to be recognized and remembered.
