ARTS 4 DAY/5 NIGHT ITINERARY DISCOVER THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS BEACH

Day One: After a leisurely breakfast at a hotel of your choice take a drive to **Daytona Shores Historical Museum**, this facility highlights Daytona Beach Shores past and present. An entire wall is dedicated to racing and displays photos of the famous North and South turns of the first race track in this area, as well as an interactive picture of racing legend Sir Malcolm Campbell and his Bluebird car. Also featuring an audio presentation that tells the history of racing in Daytona Beach Shores. Later in the day visit **The Museum at Daytona Harley-Davidson**, this new attraction showcases a variety of displays, memorabilia, and items for purchase. Guests can expect to see exclusive collections of motorcycle enthusiasts and collectors, including selections from Bruce Rossmeyer's personal collection, along with displays that depict historical moments in Harley-Davidson history.

Day Two: Off to the **Museum of Arts & Sciences**, a Smithsonian affiliate, the MOAS, located on a 90-acre Florida nature preserve, hosts some truly amazing treasures, including the finest collection of American Art in the southeast, the largest collection of Cuban art outside of Cuba, a Chinese art collection, and even a 13,000-year old Giant Ground Sloth. Also on display is Coca-Cola entrepreneur Chapman Root's lifetime collection of Americana, including two private rail cars. The museum also includes a theater, planetarium, a children's museum, and the new Visible Storage Museum. Mid-afternoon be sure to visit **Museum of Florida Art**, enjoy permanent and traveling exhibits by southeastern and national artists. Programs include films, lectures and workshops.

Day Three: Explore Halifax Historical Museum, the Daytona Beach area's rich and colorful history through permanent and changing exhibits, extensive archives and childrens exhibits. The museum also includes a unique gift shop. Don't forget to visit Jackie Robinson Ballpark & Museum you will relive history in this minor league ballpark where ground-breaking African-American baseball legend Jackie Robinson played the first integrated Major League Baseball spring training game in March 1946. The ballpark features a statue of Robinson, historical markers and an outdoor museum.

Day Four: And there is more......**Deland Naval Air Station Museum,** this former WWII training base for dive-bomber pilots offers a variety of interesting war artifacts. Once in Deland be sure to visit **Deland Memorial Hospital Museum,** built in 1922, this unique museum features a restored operating room and apothecary, along with the Gallery of Ice and Electricity, Gallery of Veterans Memorabilia, Gallery of Black Heritage, Elephant Fantasyland, and a Veterans Memorial Wall.
