**Historic Downtown Costumed Walking Tour/Tavern in the Garden,** *Thursday Evenings, June – September* This hour-long outdoor theater begins at 7:00 pm at 25 Public Square in Elizabethtown. From there you will take a leisurely stroll back in time as you are guided through the downtown to meet prominent figures in American history such as P.T. Barnum, Jenny Lind, General George Armstrong Custer, and Carrie Nation. You will also be introduced to some not-so-famous characters who have very interesting stories to tell. The tour consists of walking around a block with frequent stops. Thursday evenings 7:00pm – 8:00pm. Visit the **Tavern in the Garden at the Brown-Pusey House** and enjoy refreshments served by a barmaid in period costume and listen to the music provided by local talent, open from 6:00 - 9:00 pm. *800-437-0092* 

#### Historic Buildings at Freeman Lake Park

**Lincoln Heritage House** —Although this beloved historic double cabin was gutted by fire early in 2009, the community rebuilt the house using historic building materials including salvaged timbers in 2011.

**Sara Bush Johnston Lincoln Memorial** – A replica of the home of Sarah Bush Johnston, Abraham Lincoln's stepmother.

**One Room School House** – The 'finest school in the county' originally built in 1892.

#### The Historic State Theater

## The Hardin County Schools Performing Arts Center (The PAC)

The PAC is a regional performing arts center located in the heart of Kentucky, dedicated to bringing professional-quality experiences to our community. The center seats just under 800 and is equipped with a Broadway style bus-and-truck roadhouse stage with a full fly system, orchestra pit lift and a soon to be added orchestral shell.
