

Wyandotte County Park is maintained by the Parks and Recreation Department of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County / Kansas City Kansas. It is just one of many family attractions that exist within our large park system.

The 540 acres for the Wyandotte County Park was purchased in 1960 to prevent development around the National Agricultural Center and Hall of Fame. The park by itself is 325 acres with picnic shelters, tennis courts, softball fields, a skate park, a 6-hole junior golf course, a large playground, the George Meyn Building and the Wyandotte County Museum. The park will soon be the home of a new multi-field athletic complex being built in partnership between the Unified Government and the Sporting Kansas City Professional Soccer Team. The George Meyn building is just one of the many reservation facilities available throughout the year for both family and corporate special events.

You will also find within Wyandotte County Park several major seasonal tourist attractions. The park has been home to the Kansas City Renaissance Festival for over 30 years. The Festival is open for great family entertainment on weekends and holidays from early September to mid October. The Festival attracts over 140,000 guests each year from throughout the region. Right next door to the Festival Grounds is Cricket Wireless Amphitheatre. This unique outdoor concert venue hosts major concerts throughout the summer months and attracts over 100,000 visitors each year.
