



From extreme adventures to the pitmasters of Kansas City, here are a few story ideas that will surely peak your readers interest.









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1. A True Melting Pot

With no ethnic majority, Kansas City, KS is one of the most diverse cities in the country. Kansas City is 40 percent white, 29 percent Latino and 26 percent African-American. Kansas City is home to three museums that once were former residence offering a window to the past of how Kansas City became the diverse melting pot it is today.

Strawberry Hill Museum - Strawberry Hill Museum preserves the history of the eastern Europeans who immigrated to Kansas City, KS and called the Strawberry Hill area home. www.strawberryhillmuseum.org

Old Quindaro Museum - Quindaro Museum preserves the rich history of the town "Quindaro" where runaway slaves once found sanctuary. See old-fashioned shackles and learn about the families and their stories. www.ccoq.org

Grinter Place - Home to Moses Grinter who established the first ferry across the Kansas River. Moses married Annie Marshall, a Lenape (Delaware) Indian. Together they operated the ferry and a trading post that exchanged goods for cash and fur from the Delaware's. www.kshs.org/grinter_place

National Agricultural Center and Hall of Fame - The only museum chartered by congress to honor America's farmers. The museum is home to President Truman's plow, Poultry Museum, Museum of Farming, National Farmers Memorial. Richard Petty Driving Experience - Ride shotgun or drive a stock car around the track up to speeds of 155 mph. www.drivepetty.com


Zip KC - Get a bird's-eye view of the city as you zip line over the forest and reach speeds of nearly 55 mph. www.zipkc.com



The highest Rooftop Patio in Kansas City, Kansas is at Dave & Buster's.
