SOUTHWEST LOUISIANA CASINO EXPANSIONS UNDERWAY



Delta Downs Racetrack Casino & Hotel in Vinton, La. is undergoing a \$45 million expansion project slated for completion in December 2016. The first phase was recently complete by opening **Rosewater Grill and Tavern** with a menu that includes mouth-watering steaks, seafood, cocktails and craft beer overlooking the racetrack. The centerpiece of the project is a new hotel tower, featuring 167 additional guest rooms and suites. Additionally, all 200 existing rooms and food and beverage outlets will be redesigned and their event center will be enlarged to better accommodate meeting and banquet functions.

Golden Nugget Lake Charles, located adjacent to L'Auberge Casino Resort, is currently adding an additional 300-room hotel tower this year, bringing the resort to 1,040 rooms. Each of the additional rooms will be over 500 square feet and will contain a five-fixture bathroom with two sinks, walk-in shower, oversized tub and a separate toilet. The \$700+ million property features 30,000 square feet of meeting space, an 18-hole golf course, 12 renowned restaurants and eight boutiques and gift shops. The **Isle of Capri** recently opened a new 13-table Poker Room in the non-smoking section of the casino. The Poker Room offers a variety of live poker games seven days a week.

In addition to the recent opening of Favorites Southern Kitchen, **L'Auberge Casino Resort's** brand new food outlet is Modern Pantry. This grab-and-go restaurant is open 24 hours and serves fresh soups, salads, sandwiches, gelato and house-made desserts plus PJ's coffee.

CRAFT BREWERY RESURGENCE

Crying Eagle Brewing Co. is under construction in Lake Charles with a 15,000-square-foot facility to produce craft beer. It will feature indoor and outdoor stages, a private events space and a landscaped outdoor beer garden.

The brewery, which will occupy 10.4 acres of land near McNeese State University's Cowboy Stadium, will draw tourists to Lake Charles, help invigorate the area's economy and distribute products nationwide. In 2014, the Craft Beer Industry had a \$646 million economic impact in Louisiana.

Crying Eagle will serve seasonal hand-crafted beers and will feature a two-story tap room. The brewery will also offer tours and have live band performances. Crying Eagle Brewing is expected to open in late spring with at least three handcrafted brews to offer the public.

Being that the brewery is located in Calcasieu Parish, the name "Crying Eagle" is a nod to the region's history and culture. The Atakapa word "quelqueshue" — source of the word "Calcasieu" — means "crying eagle."



The craft beer tourism trend has been on the rise for a while, and another brewery, Rikenjaks Brewing Company, is about to make a comeback in Lake Charles, which first made its debut in the 1990s. Rikenjaks is set to make a rebirth this spring as a new venue for drinking, eating and music.
